  - x CTE STEM courses:
    - o The development of CTE options is encouraging for the future.
    - o So much work done on CTE participation and completion, due to great district staff andleadership.
    - o Female participations in courses for the STEM fields is increasing cially in computer programming as well as video game and webpage design.
  - x Post secondaryneollment:
    - o Threequarters of BSD graduates are enrolling in either two war-year institutions within two years.
    - o Post secondary enrollment is well above state averages, particularly for ELL students (66% vs. 41%)
    - o Enrollment rates are above national averages for similar urban schools.
